## How Seawilding can help

01 **Community**

Get your local community enthused and bought in to the idea

Come along to an open day or ask Seawilding to speak at an event to inspire your community


02 **Form a group**

Form a constituted group to allow access to funding

Join the Coastal Communities Network (CCN) to learn how to set up and link with other groups.


03 **Survey**

Survey your site to determine existing populations and viable restoration options/opportunity

This will be covered in the Community Restoration Training Courses.  Alternatively we can provide 1-2 day training in your community.

04 **Permissions**

Obtain the appropriate permissions and licenses for restoration

This complicated and time consuming part of the process is also covered in our training course.  We can offer 1:1 support if joint funding can be secured.


05 **Fundraising**

Raise the funding needed for your project

Seawilding has assisted project partners with fundraising and are happy to discuss partnering with your project.

06 **Equipment**

Plan and set up restoration project and infrastructure

Advice on equipment what you need and how to set up infrastructure for oyster and seagrass restoration is included in the Community Restoration Training Courses 

07 **Build skills**

Develop restoration expertise within your local community

Join the Restoration Training Courses for a ready made skill builder. 1:1 training to suit your needs can be provided if joint funding can be found. 

08 **Seed stock**

Determine where to get seed stock if needed

Loch Craignish has excellent oyster growing conditions and can provide native oysters at a size to be released on to the seabed to restoration projects.


09 **Pilot project**

Undertake pilot year of restoration

Learn all of the hands on restoration techniques required for your pilot year of seagrass or oyster restoration on the Community Restoration Training Courses. 

10 **Monitor**

Monitor and evaluate trial sites

Monitoring is also covered in the Community Restoration Training Courses.  Alternatively we can provide 1-2 day training in your community.

11 **Restoration**

If pilot project is successful, continue further fundraising to enable restoration
